

Repair Instructions

FocalPoint™ Projection Screen Bungee Loop Replacement by Draper

⚠ Caution

- ① Read instructions through completely before proceeding; retain for future reference.
- ② Handle viewing surface with care; do not allow it to come in contact with sharp or dirty objects and place it on a clean surface before beginning work.
- ③ Be extremely careful. Knife may slip and cause injury to fingers.

Kit Includes:

- Replacement Bungee Loop
- Replacement Pull Tab

Tools Required:

- Black Gaffer Tape
- Knife
- Small Screwdriver
- Scissors



- ① Carefully make a slit on the **BACK SIDE** of the black border, in a straight line from the edge of the border down. **DO NOT** cut through stitching in the border, or through the front side of the border (see Fig. 1).

⚠ **Caution:** Be extremely careful. Due to material thickness knife may easily slip and cause injury to fingers.

- ② Carefully make a second slit in a straight line directly across the first slit and below the bottom of the plastic bungee attachment points (see Fig. 2). **DO NOT** cut through the front side of the border.

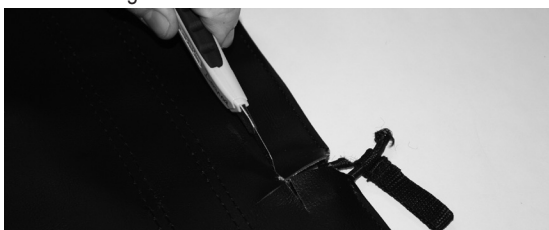

Please Note: The two cuts should create a butterfly opening and allow access to bungee attachment points.

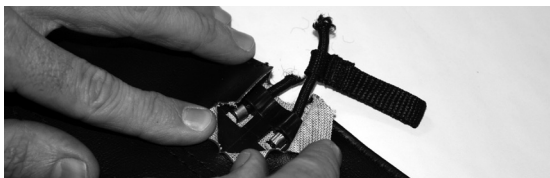

- ③ Pry out the broken bungee loop using a small screwdriver (see Fig. 4).

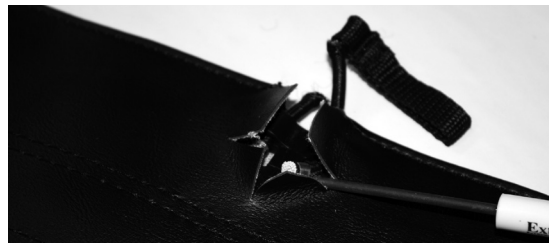

- ④ Make sure area is clear of broken pieces (see Fig. 5).

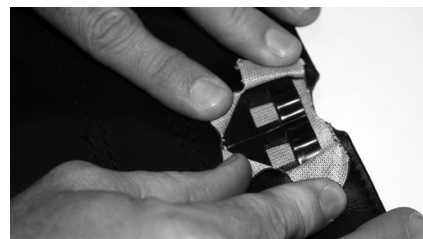

- ⑤ Thread one end of the Bungee Loop Replacement down through one of the plastic hole openings (see Fig. 6).

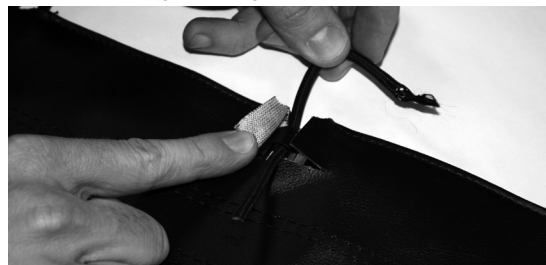

- ⑥ Tie a knot in Bungee below the plastic hole (see Fig. 7).

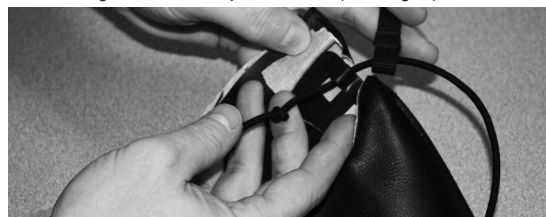

- ⑦ Place Pull Tab on Bungee. Pull Bungee tight so that knotted end is fully seated in plastic saddle.
- ⑧ Thread Bungee back down through the remaining plastic hole. Tie a knot in the other end of the Bungee. Make sure height of new Bungee Loop will equal other loops (see Fig. 8).

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- ⑨ Cut off excess Bungee, making sure to leave some excess bungee beneath the knot (see Fig. 9).

- ⑩ Inspect to make sure new Bungee Loop is seated correctly.
- ⑪ Applying **normal** pressure, tug to make sure the replacement Bungee Loop will hold.

- ⑫ Apply black gaffer tape over the repair area to cover the cuts (see Fig. 10).

- ⑬ Once the repair is completed and the black gaffer tape is in place, the repair site on the back side of the border should be virtually invisible from a distance. (see Fig. 11).
